ABOUT THE URI TOWN

Tehsil Uri attained a historical importance after 1947 as it was annexed to Baramulla District after being a part of District Muzaffarabad (Now in POK). The main town comprises of two higher secondary schools (boys and girls), a Sub-District Hospital and other educational and administrative offices. It is spread over an area of 3 kilometres, whereas other inhabited areas are spread over a radius of 30 kilometres, comprised of tough, hilly and border terrains. The college is a seat of attraction for the students within a radius of 5 to 30 kilometres of the villages like Uroosa, Silikote, Basgran, Kamalkote, Nambla, Shahdara, Salamabad, Dachi, Tilawari, Balkote, Garkote, Lagama, Bandi, Paranjilla, Dawaran, Mohra, Gingal, Bijhama, Lachipora, Mayian, Salamabad Dachina, Bagna, Chandanwari, Rampore, Boniyar, Nowshera, Chahlan, Limber, Zamboor Pattan etc. Villages like Kamalkote, Gohallan, Chrunda, Dulanja, Silikote, Lachipora and Zamboor Pattan are located just on the LOC and form a semi-circle around Uri Tehsil. Uri was in limelight during the recent past for the devastating earthquake of 8th October'2005 which measured 7.4 on the Richter scale, the earthquake did not leave even a single structure unshaken, destroying almost entire Muzaffarabad town on the other side of LOC leaving scores dead in this part besides thousand in Muzaffarabad.

Mohura Power House: It was in the year 1907, during the reign of Maharaja Pratap Singh, that the British designed a 25-cycle hydro electricity plant of 4000 kilowatts at Mohra. After some years, conversion from 25 to 50 cycles machinery costing about 2 crores of rupees was set up to add 600 kilowatts to the existing capacity. Srinagar, Sopore, Baramulla and Gulmarg towns were supplied electricity from this power station. This was only the second power house in India, the first being at Mysore. The distinct feature of this power house is its wooden canal, made entirely out of local Deodar which lifted water from the foot hills of Boniyar covering 9 km length.

The town has a tint of Punjabi culture so far as the men and manners of the people are concerned. The people of Uri due to a serene climate and sky touching snowy peaks have a tremendous natural I.Q and can compete any race in any capacity if provided a proper exposure and education. The area is dominated by a multi lingual culture as they speak Pahari, Urdu, Punjabi, Gojri as well as Kashmiri. It provides shortest road connectivity to Poonch via Aliabad and Hajipir through a distance of 57 km.

Uri is key link for cross LOC trade, famous for two mega power projects i.e. Uri I and Uri II and a reserve of gypsum, which is being extracted for manufacturing plaster of paris. The forests are full of herbs which have a great medicinal value.

There have been successful attempts to grow olive, oranges and lemon by the Agriculture and Horticulture Department and the people have introduced cultivation of these fruits as regular practice.

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Established in 2005, Govt. Degree College, Uri initially functioned in a pre-fabricated structure operating from the premises of Govt. Higher Secondary School, Uri. Subsequently, the college sought funds, to the tune of Rs. 10.78 Crore under the Special Scheme of Prime Minister's Reconstruction Programme through UGC for development and construction. The main building was constructed by JKPCC Ltd. and awaits formal hand over to the Department of Higher Education. The building comprises of six spacious smart Classrooms, 5 Laboratories for Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Physics, Computer Sciences besides a Herbarium room, Museum, Washrooms, Staff room, Conference rooms and an Auditorium of 300 seats capacity. The college has a sanctioned teaching staff capacity of 23 members besides Principal and non-teaching staff capacity of 19. The staff at present is overall young, talented and dedicated. The institution provides fully equipped state-of-art, modern laboratory facilities to the students, which are not less than the facilities provided in any other institution of the state.

The institution has streams of science, humanities and commerce. Since the modern technology has opened new vistas of communication in knowledge and education, it has also posed the challenges for the students and teachers, as they have to face competition at the state, national as well as international level. Although the institution offers admission in limited subjects in basic sciences, humanities and commerce, but our commitment to excellence and consolidation in quality is firm and unshakable. In addition to these courses subjects like Public Administration, Kashmiri, Music and Fine Art, Food Technology, Geography and Geology are also under active consideration for introduction in coming days.

This year the college shall achieve another milestone, as it has opted for accreditation by NAAC (National Accreditation as Assessment Council of Govt. of India). NAAC accredits the Higher Education Institutions, after a self study report presented by the colleges and further cross checked by the NAAC Peer team. It provides a chance to the institution to grow on specific bench marks fixed by the national and international organizations. Although we are aware of our limitations in academics and other related fields, but we are aware of the opportunity, which the circumstances have offered. The young institution has the potential to catch-up with the growth curve it finds itself in, since it does not carry the burden of hardened attitudes and outdated traditions. This institution being a young one can easily accept the change and adopt to a course of progress which in tune with the best practices of established institutions of national and international repute.

The institution is abreast with the modalities described in the recently framed National Education Policy – 2020 and is satisfactorily moving ahead and touching milestones of progress and desirable goals laid in NEP 2020.

ADMISSIONS-2022

Procedure and Regulations:

Students are advised to seek guidance from teachers and Counseling Cell, before filling up their final choice of subjects in admission forms. Moreover, they should try to recognize their skill and interest before making a final selection of courses.

Govt. Degree College Uri is affiliated to the University of Kashmir, Hazratbal, Srinagar, therefore all its rules and regulations govern the academic (Admission, Teaching & Examination) activities of the college. University with the aim of enhancing quality of education and to prepare students for upcoming challenges in their lives, has switched over to Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). A student is required to attend six periods of one hour a week for sixteen weeks, to complete a 06 Credits course i.e. minimum of four months per semester. Accordingly the students are required to complete 22 credits, during the semester. Therefore students may select three core courses (18 Credits), and Two 2 credit courses in each semester.

The option of selection of core subjects shall be available to the students pursuing the B.A/B.Sc. Every student, irrespective of the programme, shall have to study one of the 4 Credit Ability Enhancement/Skill Enhancement Course compulsorily in each Semester. The students of B.Com. (General Programme) shall have to take up the Compulsory Generic Elective in 1st and 2nd Semesters and General English in 3rd & 4th Semesters in addition to Discipline Specific / other Courses and General English of 2 credits each in 5th & 6th semesters.

Eligibility:

The eligibility and other conditions for admission shall be as under:

1. The applicant candidate/s must have passed their 10+2 Examination from the J&K Board of School Education or any other recognized Board whose Examinations have been considered as Equivalent to the corresponding Examination.
2. The candidate seeking admission to B.Sc programme shall have passed the qualifying examination with not less than 45% Marks in case of Open/General Category and 40% Marks in case of Reserved Categories.
3. Candidate/s having passed the 12th class examination with Science /Home science/Commerce subject may be allowed to opt for arts Subjects. However, candidates with non commerce Back ground seeking admission in commerce stream should have passed the qualifying Examination with at least 45% Marks in case of Open/General Category and 40% Marks in case of reserved Categories.
4. Form for UG Registration (2022) and downloading of forms shall be available online only from **15-06-2022 to 05-07-2022**. Candidates must follow the instructions, mentioned in the user Guide strictly for submitting application forms online.
5. The application forms shall be generated on the basis of J&K BOSE Registration Number and payment of university fee starts from **15-06-2022 to 05-07-2022**. In case of non availability of Registration Number on the University website, he/she

shall have to visit the University Information Centre of the College along with all Original Certificates where he/she intends to seek admission.

6. The candidate/s whose result is awaited or are appearing in the 10+2 examination of CBSE or any other recognized Board or have applied for Re-evaluation shall be eligible to apply for provisional admission on their own risk and responsibility on production of undertaking duly sworn in before the 1st Class Magistrate. However, such candidates who fail to submit their respective Form on **06-07-2022 to 15-07-2022** shall be required to pay a non refundable of Rs.1000/= and after the due date **16-07-2022 to 25-07-2022** with late fee of Rs.2000/= in lieu of admission fee in the College concerned and their admission shall be subject to fulfilment of eligibility conditions as laid down in the statutes. They shall be required to submit the required documents along with the admission and examination fee within 10 days after attaining eligibility.
7. It shall be mandatory for the candidates admitted in the Colleges even on provisional basis to attend the classes regularly as their attendance for eligibility to appear in the semester end Examination shall be counted from the date of commencement of Class work. The commencement of class work shall start from 01-08-2022.
8. The Colleges shall ensure that Admissions(Including Late Admission) on payment of late fee as prescribed for the purpose are completed by or before **15-09-2022** so that the class work for 1st Semester is started without any delay. The date may extended at discretion of University of Kashmir.
The admission forms should be supported with the following documents of the candidates:
 - i. Original Higher Secondary School Leaving & Character Certificates.
 - ii. Self attested photocopy of Secondary School Examination (10th Class) 02 Copies.
 - iii. Self attested photocopy of Higher Secondary School Examination Part II (12th Class) 02 Copies.
 - iv. Category Certificate (ST/SC/OBC/RBA/PSP), if any.
 - v. Migration certificate (wherever applicable).
 - vi. Photocopy of Certificate from the competent authority of being Orphan/ Physically Challenged.

Note: The eligibility of the pass out candidates of 12th class other than J&K Board of School Education, shall be determined subject to the submission of Original Migration Certificate(s) from respective institutions and equivalence certificate of 12th class from J&K Board of School Education.

PROGRAMMES OFFERED

Subject Combinations for Bachelors Programme under CBCS in B.Sc (Medical), B.Sc (Non-Medical), Commerce(B.Com) and Arts/Social Science(B.A) Faculties:

A. B.Sc. General Programme (Life/Earth Sciences Group): Core Subjects: Any three courses from Groups I to VI with maximum of one from a group and one Ability/Skill Course from Group VII in each Semester and a 2 Credit English Course from 3rd to 6th Semesters:

B. B.Sc N. General Programme (Physical/Earth Sciences Group): Core Subjects: Any three courses from Groups I to VI with maximum of one from a group and one Ability Skill course from Group VII in each Semester and 2 Credit English Course from 3rd to 6th Semesters. Any student opting for Physics shall have to take Mathematics as compulsorily core subject.

C. B.A (General Programme):

Students are required to choose two subjects from Group II to VI with a maximum of one subject from each group. They can also opt for one subject from Group I, where as English Communicative Skills and Environmental Studies are compulsory courses for students from Arts subjects for 1st and 2nd Semester.

MIL in 1st & 2nd, General English in 3rd & 4th Semesters and 2 Credit English in 5th & 6th Semesters each: Core Courses: Any two courses from other groups G II to G VI with a maximum of one from a group, one Ability/Skill Course from Group VII in each Semester.

Fee Details for 1st and 2nd Semester of Under-Graduate Programme:

1. The Registration Fee is non-refundable and needs to be submitted with the Registration Form only once.
2. The University Service Charges payable at the time of admission to odd semesters shall be paid along with the Registration Fee.
3. The rest of the fee for 1st and 2nd semesters shall be submitted at the time of Admission of the candidate. However, the candidates, who belong to the Orphan Category (Evidence by the death certificate issued by the competent authority) or with 40% or more Physical Disability (as certified by the CMO concerned) shall be exempted from payment of examination fee.

STUDENT SERVICES

College Bus: The College offers 40 seater bus service to the students on concessional fares. A committee headed by Convener, Transport Committee including representatives from students works out the expenditure incurred on maintenance and fuel of college bus. Accordingly the fares are calculated and the students are expected to deposit the monthly bus fee in advance.

Canteen: The college shall offer refreshments including tea and cold drinks on concessional rates to its students. The college invites tenders from reputed businessmen in the trade and the rate for snacks and beverages is fixed on the competitive basis. The students are supposed to benefit from the services and ensure maintenance of quality in the items served. The canteen committee shall also include representatives from the students to be selected in beginning of each academic session.

Library & Reading Room: Library plays a vital role in the search of knowledge. It serves as the workshop for the entire college – students and faculty alike. **GDC Uri College Library** aims to support the teaching learning activity in the college and also provide the students updated knowledge and to ensure the optimum utilization of the available resources. Since inception of college, the library is catering to the needs of wide spectrum of users and continuously expanding its horizons in terms of collection, services and operations. The College library is located in a spacious and well ventilated hall annexed with the Browsing Centre/Reading Room on the top floor of the college. The inmates are supposed to be aware of the system and report any undesired activity to the college grievances redressal cell for effective handling of the cases.

Gymnasium: The institution provides this facility during the working hours to male and female students. This is the most modern 7 point gym for physical fitness. It is expected that the students make use of this facility in their leisure for physical fitness.

Drinking Water: The institution has acquired latest water purification systems for its staff and students which is expected to be in place by the beginning of this academic session. The construction agency has been requested to provide uninterrupted electricity and water supply to make water purification systems functional. In the meantime each department is equipped with a water purifier for storage of drinking water.

Female Common Room: This facility has been added up to the institution in the session 2012. The female students can relax while enjoying their privacy in the room. Adequate facilities are being provided for them. Adequate Wash room facilities are available for female students in the first floor of the building adjacent to class rooms. They shall also get the services of a female attendant in the room.

Health Care: As the institution is striving to create basic health care and First AID facilities within the institution it has also maintained a close liaison with the authorities at Sub-District Hospital in the town which is at a stone's throw from the institution. The staff there takes due care of our students particularly those who have the history of any type of medical problems. The students having any type of medical problem should register their problems with the administration so that the institution contributes its bit in improving the health conditions of such students and the emergencies are dealt on priority.

Scholarship/Financial Assistance: Department of Minority Affairs of the Government of India provides financial support in shape of scholarship to the students of National Minorities which include Muslims, Sikhs and Christians. The college offers guidance for applying to this scholarship as and when those are invited from the Department. The

Department of Social Welfare also provides scholarship to the students hailing from backward areas and belonging to deprived sections of the society including RBA, ST, SC, and Physically Challenged. The students shall apply on prescribed forms as and when notification to this effect is issued by the college. In the mean-time they are advised to obtain the relevant Income and Category certificates from the concerned authorities. State Advisory Board for Development of Pahari Speaking People, Govt. of Jammu & Kashmir has been also providing financial support to the Pahari Speaking students. The college also supports the financial needs of the poor students out of its limited resources. The students shall apply for this financial support during the session as and when the applications are invited by the concerned committee.

Browsing Centre: The College has the facility of browsing centre provided to the staff and students in order to increase their access to knowledge sources of various kinds. Basic infra structure which includes the BSNL leased circuit 10 mbps is catering to the internet connectivity of browsing centre which has a 6 KV online UPS installed with 20 PC's and other allied accessories in place. The browsing centre also has the facility of printing and all systems are on the LAN with a server installed.

Distance Education: In the modern days education has transcended from the geographical, age and time boundaries. Distance education has come up as a strong medium for those sections of society, who want to get education on their own convenience and pace. The sections of society which are not able to attend regular educational mode, due to variety of reasons can opt for distance mode of education. The college houses a centre of "Maulana Azad National Urdu University (MANUU)" which is head quartered at Gachi Bowli, Hyderabad. The University with its programmes for providing education through distance mode in Urdu medium has a variety of courses to offer for the learners. The distance mode of learning puts no barrier of age, time etc. The students after getting enrolled for a course of their choice receive high quality study material by post to his residence. The establishment of IGNOU Study Centre is in pipeline.

Photostat: The institution has a documentation cell where xerox facility is provided to the students on concessional rates. The Xerox facility is also available in the browsing centre.

Air Conditioning: Govt. Degree College Uri has the distinction of having Air Conditioning facility for its students. Since the institution witnesses higher temperature during summer, the college Development Committee installed split AC's in library, Browsing Centre and reading room halls. This facility is expected to enhance motivation among students to visit reading room and library during their presence in the college and seek benefits of reading and internet browsing.

Sports: Education is incomplete without a sound physical status. A young man should strive for balancing academic efforts with physical activities. The college shall encourage its students (Male & Female) to participate in a variety of indoor and outdoor games. As our students are good in Volley Ball, Kabbadi as a rural sport they have also

interests in Cricket and Football and Cycling. The institution has established a mountaineering and hiking club keeping in view the specific talent of the students belonging to this part of the country. The institution has sufficient equipment available for athletic events like Javelin Throw, Discuss Throw, High Jump, Long Jump and Shot put etc.

NCC and NSS: The college has functional units of both for benefit of students.

STUDENTS' CODE OF CONDUCT

The institution attaches top most priority to the discipline, which is a basic requisite for conducive academic atmosphere. Besides the members of College Discipline Committee, members of teaching and non-teaching staff closely monitor the behaviour of college inmates. The students are advised to adhere to following rules during their stay in the institution:

1. Ragging is prohibited and any student indulging in this unlawful activity will have to face cancellation of his/her admission from the institution. This has been declared a cognizable offence which can lead to imprisonment of minimum two years.
2. Only the students possessing a valid Identity Card of the institution are allowed inside the campus.
3. Students should present themselves in a proper dress while attending the institution.
4. Students getting private vehicles should register their vehicle numbers with the institution.
5. Smoking or carrying tobacco or any other toxic substance shall invite a strict disciplinary action.
6. No student is allowed to take law in his own hand. In case any student has a grievance, it should be addressed to Convener, Grievance Cell or the Head of the institution.
7. Uniform Male Students --- White Shirt, Black Pants & Sweaters, Black Jackets/Coats, Black Shoes.

Uniform Female students --- White Kameez, White Salwar with White Dupatta, Black Sweater (Optional Black Abaya), Black Shoes.
